OUTDOOR LIVING, MANUAL STYLE



...add a few colorful accents that echo your surroundings and bring the look together.

A well-defined outdoor room with a clear sense of style is an extension of your living space and an addition to your home's value.

An outdoor room should show seamlessly from your house's architecture and style of decoration; for example, a country home can open onto a rustic patio with wicker furniture, terra-cotta pots and galvanized watering cans.

DESIGN FEATURES

A sheltered outdoor room will maximize your year-round use of space. Consider building a permanent overhang or roof, or installing a retractable awning for more versatility.

Stay warm on cooler days and evenings with patio heaters or portable outdoor space heaters, and if budget and bylaws permit, install an outdoor fireplace or chimney.

Candles are charming decorative accents, but if you intend to spend plenty of time outdoors in the evenings, installing wired outdoor lighting is a more practical option.

OUTDOOR FURNITURE

Most outdoor furniture lasts longer if sheltered during the winter. Consider lightweight furniture options like all-weather wicker, resin or metal frames with woven seats. Choose furniture with water-resistant cushions and fabric only if you have convenient storage at hand, or have a covered outdoor space.

Generally, position your outdoor furniture to take advantage of the best view. Pick a neutral scheme and simple designs for furniture, fabrics and accessories, and add a few colorful accents that echo your surroundings and bring the look together.

ACTIVITY ZONES

Create specific areas for relaxation, recreation and tasks. For reading, include a comfortable chair and a table for placing a book, drink or a snack. A simple two-seater bistro dining set can become an alfresco dining area for four by pulling up extra folding chairs; if you have the space, plan on a minimum 9×9 ft area for a 4 ft diameter table.

ALFRESCO KITCHEN

Go beyond the barbecue! Full service outdoor cooking centers are increasingly popular, and are practical if you do a lot of outdoor entertaining or live in a climate where you can spend a lot of time outdoors year-round. Purchase or build a barbecue island with storage, a sink and even a small fridge, depending on your budget and needs.

GARDENING ZONE

You're ready to garden! Before you roll up those sleeves, it's a good idea to do some research on which plants are best for your zone.

5 TIPS FOR CHOOSING PLANTS

- Choose plants that are suitable for your climate as they will be better able to fend for themselves, so that gardening will be less laborintensive.
- When deciding which plants will go where, select a mix of evergreens, perennials and annuals for year-round interest.
- Plant small flowering trees, which are easy to integrate into your garden plan.
- 4. Choose ornamental grasses to give your garden landscaping height and an almost maintenance-free elegance.
- 5. Don't forget to factor in the light: how much sun does each part of the garden get? Plants for partial shade should receive no more than six hours of sun a day; plants for full sun should get at least six hours of sun a day.

3 STEPS TO PLANTING

Once you have drawn up a garden landscaping plan, it's time to get down and dirty.

Begin by preparing the soil for planting; starting with good quality soil
is 90 percent of your gardening success. Determine what kind of soil
is native to your area, and depending on how friendly that is to the

- plants you have in mind, supplement your garden's natural soil with a universally accepted planting mixture from your garden store.
- 2. When placing plants in the ground, bear in mind that the crown of the plant—where stems meet the top of the pot it came in—should stand 2- to 3-in (5- to 8-cm) above soil level.
- 3. Then, mould the soil up to the crown; this helps guard against plant rot. When you water, any moisture that flows into the crown won't drain away and could rot the plant. Most plants need to dry out a bit between watering for their roots to breathe. Don't overwater! ##

TIP: MAKE A HERB GARDEN

Nothing beats fresh, fragrant herbs for your favourite recipes—just a few steps from your kitchen! So why not add a container herb garden to your outdoor space?

Choose a large planter (round or rectangular will work) and plant small herb plants like parsley, chives, mint, oregano, dill and basil. They will all work together in the same container as long as it is large enough.

With regular watering, herbs are very easy to maintain, and will last all season. When it becomes too cold, bring the container inside for the winter.

GARDEN décor

Like any interior room, decorative accents give your garden the finishing touch. Quality lawn and garden décor pieces are the visual and aural grace notes that define your garden's style, reflecting the mood you want to create.

Design a dynamic landscape

When deciding where to place garden accessories, be sure to take the height of the surrounding plants and landscaping into consideration. If you have a lush garden of tall grasses and flowering plants, consider accessories that are a foot tall or higher. If the item is to be a focal point, it can be somewhat larger or taller than the surrounding garden features. Smaller, lower accessories are charming when placed in garden beds and borders, or near low-growing plants.

Create a tranquil hideaway

Install seating beneath a tree or arbor, such as a stone bench, a sturdy wooden swing or an outdoor hammock. Hang a wood and steel wind chime nearby to send pleasant notes into the air.

Add water elements

A fountain, either on its own or as part of a pond system, adds a pleasant water element to your landscape. Install this feature near areas you frequent, such as a garden path or a seating area, to optimize your enjoyment of the sound and view of running water.

Consider lighting

For outdoor gazebos or trees with strong, low limbs, an outdoor candle-bearing chandelier or tealight candle lanterns can be a breathtakingly beautiful accent, especially when lit during the evening. Asian-inspired lanterns with colored glass panels create an environment that feels both festive and romantic.

DID YOU KNOW?

Individual pieces can also help draw attention to attractive landscaping features, and away from any less attractive features; a pair of Grecian urns complements a handsome front entrance, and an arbor can screen an unsightly view beyond your garden.
